Fundraising Report

- We are truly excited to host Rabbi Melman's 18 years of service celebration which is on Sunday April 26th from 5 to 8pm. As we have announced before this will be CBS annual fundraising event with Dinner, Entertainment and Tribute Book. We will also have an exciting Raffle prize for this event.

House Report

- **Parking lot**

Have spent \$405,000 of budgeted 450,000 and will finish with some landscaping and lighting improvements in the spring. Remainder of money will remain in Hineynu for other projects.

- **Security Enhancements**

- Security improvements are continually be incorporated and reviewed. We intend on issuing a letter to the congregation soon to let them know some of the basic measure we have taken without sharing specifics. We also want them to be able to feel "safe" in our "home" CBS.

- New door handles will be on the sanctuary and social hall and kitchen doors and some hold open closures will replace kick stops.
- Hired security and police procedures are being reviewed.
- Security personnel are in the building only for security job reasons; they are not to be door openers and foyer greeters/attendants.
- We will be setting up some additional training for all Lay Leaders and Ambassadors in the next months and identifying some possible volunteer roles especially for Shabbat.
- **Repairs**
 - 2 heat exchangers need replacing, one in each of the 30 ton social hall units; to be installed week of Jan 13; under \$5000/exchanger. These are units that would cost over \$60,000 to fully replace.
 - New ovens ordered for Melman parsonage; heating element stopped working.
- **Capital Reserve report**

The asset life schedule has been updated and shared with Financial Committee for budget use.
