- **Revenues**
 - Membership fees are expected to be consistent with budgeted amounts; Michael has been making calls to those members with large outstanding balances.
 - B'nai mitzvah fees are expected to fall short of budget by approximately \$11,000 as five families with scheduled simchas for the year dropped their memberships.
 - The success of the upcoming fundraiser will largely determine whether the fundraising budget is met.

- **Expenses**
 - Landscaping and Building Facility Repair expenses will be reviewed to verify whether they were actually parking lot related and whether they should be reimbursed from the building fund.
 - We are currently working with Federation to apply for a Federal grant which may recoup some security costs already paid.

- Operating cash balances reflect a \$229,000 decline over the month. This is due to the transfer of \$86,000 in Hineynu collections to Vanguard as well as the use of cash to pay bills; most cash is collected from congregants from July-December.

- **Thursday, February 27th: Lox Box, Box Making.** On this evening, we will gather in Roser Hall starting at 6:30 PM to take the cardboard boxes that are currently palletized and open them up and get them ready to be filled. We should be done by 8:30 PM.
- **Saturday, February 29th: Lox Box Packing.** This is the chaos before the storm, but it is a fun family friendly event. Starting at 6:30 PM, we lay out all the boxes on the floor of Rosner Hall and systematically put the ingredients into each box. While this is going on, others are in Dickler Hall filling bags with all the donated ad specialties, reading materials as well as our Sponsorship/Coupon Booklet. Have you ever seen 8,000 bagels in one place? If not, then you need to be there between 9:00PM and 9:15PM when the bagels start coming fast and furious. After they cool off (yes, we get them hot off the press) we pack them into half dozen bags and then off to the boxes they go. **Please bring your whole family.
