This Week's Parashah

Pinchas is the son of the priest Elazar. His zeal in slaying the Israelite man and the Midanite woman (see previous portion), wins him the reward of priesthood for himself and his descendants for all time. Moses and Elazar take a census of all male Israelites over twenty years of age. As God had decreed, all adults who had been a part of the first census, except for Joshua and Caleb, died in the desert on the journey toward the Promised Land. Five daughters of Zelophehad protest the injustice that land was not given to their family solely because their father had no sons. God advises Moses that the plea of the daughters is iust. God tells Moses to ascend the mountains to see the land given to the Israelites. Although he may see the land, he will never enter it. Moses is told to ordain Joshua the son of Nun as his successor. The portion concludes with instructions for the daily, Sabbath, monthly, and festival sacrifices to be brought before God.

Today's Haftarah

In a memorable confrontation with the priests of the foreign god Baal, Elijah the prophet had demonstrated to the people of Israel that there was no God other than the God of Israel. When the heretic priests were subsequently killed, Elijah was forced to flee from their protector, Queen Jezebel, wife of King Ahab. Elijah ends up in Beersheva where God reveals God's self - not in the wind. not in an earthquake, and not in fire. but in a still, small voice. The Torah and Haftarah readings are linked through the personalities of the men at the core of the two readings. Both Pinchas in the Torah reading and Elijah in the Haftarah are two men of great zeal and highly devoted to God's service.
