This Week's Parashah

Moses is told to instruct the Israelites to bring olive oil to light the lamps of the Tabernacle. The lamps are to burn from evening until morning. The lamps are to be the responsibility of Aaron and his sons. Moses is told to ordain Aaron and his sons as *Kohanim* (priests). The *Kohanim* are to be adorned in special clothes: linen breeches, tunics, sashes, and turbans. The *Kohen Gadol* (high priest) is to wear a special robe of pure blue decorated at the hem with pomegranates and golden bells. Over this robe, an apron-like layer (the *Ephod*) woven of gold, blue, purple, and crimson yarns is to be worn. Connected to the *Ephod* is "the breastplate of judgment" (*choshen*) - a square-shaped container decorated on the front with four rows of precious stones. The *Kohen Gadol* is also to wear a gold plate engraved "*Holy to the Lord*" to be tied with a blue cord to the front of his turban. The *Kohanim* are to be ordained in a special ceremony which involved first washing, dressing, and anointing them with oil, and secondly, the offering of various sacrifices. These ceremonies are to be repeated for seven days.

Today's Haftarah

Ezekiel, prophesying from exile, shares vivid apocalyptic visions. One of these is a vision of the future Third Temple, and part of this vision is the Haftarah selection for Parashat Tetzaveh. At the opening of the Haftarah, God instructs Ezekiel to share with the people of Israel all the details of this future Temple: its layout, exits, entrances, floor plan, and all the relevant laws pertaining to its construction. Though this is meant to be a comforting prophesy, God indicates that these details should make the people of Israel feel ashamed of their sins. Pairing rebuke with words of comfort is a common motif in the book of Ezekiel. In this context, the rebuke seems intended to motivate positive action—repentance and preparation for the Third Temple's construction.
