Fundraising Report

We are in the midst of selecting a caterer for the evening---Barbeque, Bourbon and Blues is the theme. A Dinner for pickup will be provided, with delivery to Sponsors. A Bourbon tasting is also being set up for the sponsors, with a TBD charge for non-sponsors. Entertainment will be provided by the Chicago Blues Network, and we are also having a raffle, and a tribute book. You are encouraged to go to the CBS Website, and click on the calendar page—top right is a tab labeled "Celebrate Rabbi Melman". There is information there on the raffle, sponsorship, the tribute book as well as reservations per person. We already have over 150 people signed up for dinner, please join us in celebrating all that Rabbi Melman has brought to us over these 18 plus years.

House Report

- **Preschool**: They are doing Lead testing for water identified 7 faucets need a re-test to be done later this spring (interesting that we have not had prior Lead test issues and the Faucets are new!)
- Water Leak Issue There was a leak in the basement for a few months coming from one of the main water valves. J Plumbing has tried to stop the leak by replacing and cleaning some of the parts inside the valve, but it still leaks. pipes are old, we've replaced a few parts, but leak persists repair is more involved now / replace portion of pipe as well as shut off valves (Quotation is for \$3835.00).
- Memorial plaques The list will be posted on MyCBS for congregation access in February. We are moving ahead with relocating about 400 plaques to library space. We need to Identify a NerTamid light for the site. May be start with a temporary unit (\$100-\$150) and then find a donor for a real Ner Tamid Light.
- Live streaming: sub-committee has been formed with participation of Ari Footlik, Dan Sher, Seth Schrank, Neil Rosengard, Rabbi Melman. Seth will assume responsibility for project. We are relocating current camera in Beit Midrash this week for better visual presentation. This is minimal cost to relocate and will be much better user experience
- o **Security FEMA Grant Program for 2021 -** Homeland Security announced program for 2021. The submission date has not been announced. It is anticipated that, we will have 6 to 8 weeks to prepare when the date is announced. Susan is meeting with a representative from Homeland Security on 2/15 with a walk through to identify a list of

potential security improvements. The list of possible security improvement projects along with their cost and priority assessments will be reviewed in March House Committee meeting. Susan will be using a local grant writer recommended by other synagogues to help write our request (He has had great success in getting grants funded) Possible ideas to request for \$100K.

- o **Tent** We have priced several Tent rental options. These are expensive investment options for just a few months that would provide minimal protection from the elements and accommodate only small number of worshipers or attendees under the current COVID guidelines. We are moving to phase 4 and most probably will be allowed a lot more people in the large sanctuary. Even with current Covid rule we can allow 25 individuals in the main sanctuary. This will also be better option with sound and streaming services. CBS task force looking into next steps. Decision is to NOT follow up with Tent options.
 - 30 x 30 tent (900 Sq Ft) for the season April 20 Sept 3 would be \$9,188. Under COVID distancing restrictions: would seat approx. 24 people theater style
 - o 30 x 45 tent (1,350 Sq Ft) for the season April 20 Sept 3rd would be \$14,513. Under COVID distancing restriction: would seat approx. 36 people theater style
 - o For reference: The Wintergarden room is approx.. 33 x 38 about 1,200 Sq Ft.
 - o For reference: the Beit Midrash seats approx. 70-75
 - Additional incidental costs required: Extend internet connection & electricity to tent (best if hard wired but could possibly work with WIFI) Portable camera and staff to manage live stream from the tent for Shabbat services. \$ unknown
- Upgrades to touchless faucets Project completed touchless soap & paper towel dispensers) are all installed
- Window repair in Wintergarden waiting for break in the weather
- Parsonage
 - o Rabbi Melman Bathroom remodeling The contractor is bonded. coordinating start of the job with Melmans. It will take 2 weeks to complete.
 - o Rabbi Ferratier garage door repair and the garage door opener were changed.
