**Preschool (Little Ones)** - Water test submitted & wo-bathroom faucets are slightly above drinking Lead levels (DCFS rules). Waiting for final reports. CBS is planning to upgrade our WIFI service with VLAN to provide Phone and Ethernet service for the Little Ones. CBS will bill Little Ones \$100 or \$150 / month for use of our internet in addition to their rent.

**CBS has received confirmation of the Grant from FEMA for \$98K.** This fund is planned to be used for the following projects:

- Continue Clear Guard window film project
- Blue Light police call boxes with speaker call box through the building
- Funding for professional security services

**Live streaming:** Sound Planning Installers have been on site all last week. So far it is all under control and within budget. We should be streaming with new equipment on Saturday am for Shabbat. We plan to be fully installed and use for the High Holiday streaming services. There will be operator on site managing the camera system for the High Holiday.

**Memorial plaques:** 40% of plaques that are planned have been moved to the new location in library. Plan to complete before High Holidays. Also, organizing the remaining plaques as per family requests. We do have a donor and requesting to partially fund the Ner Tamid.

**Sump Pump:** Following power outage on July 28<sup>th</sup> several alarms / alerts happened last week. Custodial staff replaced battery for backup, but alarms still ringing. Service call made this week to test & service backup pumps.

**Summer Projects Completed:**

- **Freezer** – We purchased a new freezer which arrived in July. It arrived slightly dented during delivery and they refunded us 15% of price – dent on back of unit- it is fully operational (and empty!!)
- **Internet** – we upgraded to Comcast One gig this week
- **Window washing** - already happening – our team doing inside and outside
- **Painting** – Pomegranates were primed and painted,

- **Silver** – volunteer Bettina Birkner has been coming in to polish the Torah decorations

**Seal Coating** – It is two years from repaving the parking lot and time for seal coating. Four quotes for sealing parking lot. We plan to schedule with Suburban Seal Coating for 8/24-25 or 8/25-26 or 8/30/31 – We will have a motion for exec and board approval.

**New CBS Signage: Walters and front entrance** – Sub-committee formed with Neil (Lead), Dan Sher, Howard, and Bill  
We do have \$10K grant from Sisterhood. Subcommittee plans to provide a design proposal and quotations for next month committee review. We will take this to the exec and board for approval. Priority is on Walters CBS sign.

**CBS U/Adult Ed** fall classes will begin in October. Classes we have so far for first semester are:

**Distinguished Speaker Series:** The Committee will be asking the Board to approve a motion at the August meeting to allocate up to \$50,000 from the Eastern European Torah Project for the 2021-22 speaker series. Any funds not expended will be returned to the EETP.

#1 *New York Times* bestselling author Daniel Silva was interviewed by his wife, CNN Special Correspondent Jamie Gangel, on July 22. We had 902 total registrants (with minor duplication). We sold 52 copies of his new book, *The Cellist*, as of Aug. 3. Additional copies remain available for \$25 each by contacting Leann or Lisa. Here is a snapshot of **screens\*** that actually logged in for the event:

- 594 unique screens
- 125 CBS Congregant screens (approx.)
- 44 Canadian screens
- 8 Australian screens
- 1 New Zealand screen
- 1 Bulgarian screen
- 1 Mexico screen

\*These screens each represent 1-4 viewers based on our anecdotal information, making our best estimation that more than 1,000 people “attended.”

Our fall Distinguished Speaker event, at 8 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 14, will feature a virtual conversation about the premier legal effort to hold accountable hate

group leaders and white supremacist organizations responsible for the 2017 violence in Charlottesville, Va. Amy Spitalnick, executive director of Integrity First for America, will detail the organization's efforts behind a lawsuit scheduled for trial in late October in Federal Court in Charlottesville. The plaintiffs are Charlottesville victims who were injured; the defendants are two dozen neo-Nazis, white supremacists, and hate groups responsible for planning and orchestrating the violence. We are in the process of inviting interfaith partners to join us for this timely, compelling program.

**Other business** – Programming will be partnering with the Membership Committee on the Sukkah Hop on Saturday afternoon, Sept. 25. If you are building a sukkah and would like to be a stop on the hop, please be sure to let Leann or Lisa know.

HAZAK is looking into hosting an event on the afternoon of Sept. 1. They are planning to have a bass player. Other information will be available soon.
