Fundraising Report

- **Preschool** - School officially opened this week after on-site inspection, school received 6 months conditional license.

Memorial plaques: Library memorial plaque is completely installed and populated. Thank you to Maria for overseeing this project. It truly adds a dignified display of CBS commitment to our families. A temporary Ner Tamid is displayed with plaques until a more permanent display is provided and installed.

Live streaming: Sound Planning has completed installation of the Sound and Video systems in CBS. We have been streaming with our new system for most of month of August. There have been several video interruptions which are primarily due to operator and learning of the new system. Plan is to be fully operational for high holiday streaming services. There will be operator on site managing the camera system for the high holiday.

Sump Pump: Following power outage on July 28th there has been several sump pumps alarms. It is determined that the backup sump pump needs to be replaced. We are waiting for 2nd quotation. The cost will be in ~\$3K range.

Seal Coating: Suburban Seal Coating \$8,835 is selected to complete this project. This was approved by the board in August meeting. They are scheduled for September 9th and 10th

New CBS Signage: Walters and front entrance – Sub-committee formed with Neil (Lead), Dan Sher, Howard and Bill - we do have a set of designs. In addition, we have selected several sign manufacturing companies. The sign companies complete the full project - from design, fabrication, and installation. Next step is to ask the sign companies for site visit to determine the proportion size of the sign and assess the location for quotation process. We will bring the proposals to the House and then to the board for approval. Considering the state of the foundation, it is not clear if we can install the new sign on existing foundation or they need to pour a new foundation. Due to the scope of the project, it is estimated that installation of new CBS sign will be in Spring of 2022.

Men's Club Torch award display - Men's Club is looking to install 9 plaques that have been awarded to Men's club over the past several years. House

Committee is reviewing all of the open wall areas with possible relocation of some of occupied areas in order to identify an appropriate place.

Commissioned Wooden Benches - Joshua Clarkweiss is a former CBS family member. He has contacted our clergy for designing and providing an art piece of a bench with Hebrew letter as a base. Cantor Stoher has requested review of this proposal with the House Committee. The Committee is looking to identify a location within the walls of CBS for these two benches. Possible locations discussed: in front of tree of life, within the memorial Plaque alcove, within the walls of the library.

CBS School Mitzvah project - Butterfly Garden – Lisa Orlov is planning to create a butterfly garden this fall within CBS outdoor area as part of the high school environment project. Jill Olefsky will provide guidance and her experience to this project.

Distinguished Speaker Series We are actively seeking community partners to join us in condemning white supremacy and violent extremism by co-sponsoring a timely and compelling fall Distinguished Speaker event at 8 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 14. StandWithUs Midwest, Techny Towers Conference and Retreat Center, Bright Star Church Chicago, and St. James Church Chicago have already joined us and will co-promote a virtual conversation about the premier legal effort to hold accountable hate group leaders and organizations responsible for the 2017 violence in Charlottesville, Va. Amy Spitalnick, executive director of Integrity First for America, will detail the organization's efforts behind a lawsuit scheduled for trial in late October in Federal Court in Charlottesville. The plaintiffs are Charlottesville victims who were injured; the defendants are two dozen neo-Nazis, white supremacists, and hate groups responsible for planning and orchestrating the violence.
