RABBI MELMAN'S MINUTES



Dorothy in
The Wizard
of Oz, reminds us of a
very important
message there's no
place like
home, Indeed.

there is no place like home. For two months, 7550 Benning Rd. at Fort Jackson in South Carolina was my home. It was more than just a house, so to speak, I made it a home. I cooked, celebrated Shabbat, decorated my room for Chanukah and lit candles. However, I have loved coming home, being back on the bima, and inside the walls of CBS.

It feels good to bring a new set of skills back to our congregational family. It feels good to bring a new sense of who I am as a rabbi, as a pastor, to our community. I've been reflecting on something I shared on the last Shabbat of 2021. Our patriarch, Jacob, requests to be buried with his father and grandfather (Isaac and Abraham). Joseph, before his death, requests that his bones be carried with the Israelites so that he may ultimately be buried in his ancestral home in the Land of Israel. Our people and our history remain connected to one another and to a very special place — a place that was home.

Shortly before Jacob's death, he gives his children and grandchildren a blessing and desires to let each one know of their destiny. Before he has the chance to reveal that information, he passes from the earth and it is up to each child to determine their own path. The message of determining one's own path is something I spent a lot of time thinking about while at the United States Army Chaplain Center and School. I believe

that my training has now allowed me to offer a new set of blessings to people. I have been able to learn more about myself and new skills that better enable me to serve our CBS family – lifelong learning isn't just a saying; it is real and it is powerful.

Jacob's children had been through a lot in the Torah and yet there was still so much that they didn't know. They dealt with famine and overall tumult in their lives. Even when they are reunited with Joseph in Egypt, they aren't sure whether he will show them compassion. Will they be punished for their treatment of their brother all those years ago? Joseph doesn't hold a grudge, he is able to let go and embrace his brothers. This clear conscience allows him to transition from this life without a heavy heart and without any grievances. Joseph wants to be brought up, literally, having his bones carried to the Land of Israel, ultimately spiritually elevating his unburdened soul.

It is up to us to take these lessons of elevation and elevate our own spirits, our own souls, and our own hearts and minds even though, with good, legitimate reason, we might be stuck. As human beings, we must not let things consume us and not let the things that are troubling us overcome us. We can turn to each other, those that love us and care about us. We here, at CBS, are some of those people. We are here for you! Share with each other, share with us.

Too often, we focus on the destination and not the journey. I have appreciated and enjoyed each step along the way. There is so much more I want to share with you about

my chaplain training, and God-willing, I will do so in person, over kiddush, at some point soon. Yes, there's no place like home, and I am excited to be here with all of you.

A friend of mine is a teacher, and he asks his students each year to help him with an experiment. He shares with me that there is always positive energy right before class starts. Hal gives his class a list of negative words and asks them to look at it for a few minutes. He asks the students to form five pictures and write five sentences. Then the questions from the students start coming in. "This is a downer." "Why are we doing this?" "We thought you wanted us to be positive."

Hal always answers back that he wanted to teach them something about the emotional impact of words. A student yelled out, "you succeeded but now we all feel crappy." One student finally yelled out, "we assume you are going to give us a page of positive words also?" He smiled and handed out the sheet of positive words. The entire atmosphere in the room changed. Animated conversation and laughter and positive energy returned. Then they did the pictures and the sentences, and the room was much livelier.

One of his students shares "Words have more impact than I thought, and these are just on paper."

If a piece of paper with words on it can lower or raise the spirits of more than thirty people within seconds, think of the effect that some of the words we speak can have on others...and on ourselves.

Choose your words wisely, as their impact can last a lifetime. Thank you for having me back at CBS. I will always be grateful for this opportunity. Call or write me anytime, so we can share some words and smile and laugh.

FROM THE CONGREGATION PRESIDENT

Shalom Chaverim,

I hope the first month of 2022 (Shevat 5782) has brought you good health both physically and spiritually. The full force of winter is upon us. I am writing this column during an 8-inch snow fall over New Year's weekend and we have temporarily closed our building due to COVID-19. I hope by the time you are reading this message our weather is much calmer and our doors have been re-opened. I am calling this message: A SIX-MONTH REVIEW: THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE UGLY.

I can't believe that I am already six months into my role as President. The summer started with our doors open to all and our summer ended with us having in-person High Holi-

day services (the GOOD). But the Delta variant raged on and took too many lives of our friends and loved ones and continued to economically cripple many members of our CBS family and extended community (the BAD). Due to the pandemic, many members who normally would be volunteering within our congregation and beyond have not been able to in order to stay safe (the necessity of this circumstance is the UGLY).

We have gone from mandating masking to mandating proof of vaccination. While I understand and accept that for the greater good this was the right decision, it was made with a great deal of internal conflict. One of my struggles (perhaps even a flaw and or curse) in my current role is that I always see the gray. I am guided by the moral imperative to keep our CBS community safe, but this decision does not come without a cost. At the time I am writing this message to you we are not able to welcome a number of our congregants in our building because of their vaccination status. In my 27 years as a member of Congregation Beth Shalom I never imagined that I would ever see this day (the BAD). I know that many of you are very appreciative of the CBS leadership for making this decision and I so appreciate the supportive messages I have received. However, I ask that you do not celebrate a necessary decision that results in the exclusion of some of our members being unable to enter our building. It is becoming much easier to vilify those who are choosing not to vaccinate. Politics and changing rules based on an evolving science (as we learn more about the variants) contribute to creating increased confusion, mistrust, and tension among most of us. I suspect that as we approach the two-year mark of this pandemic, I am not alone in feeling worn down by having this virus influencing and/or controlling so many of our daily decisions. While I am not apologetic for the decisions we have had to make regarding access to our building, I am sorry that we have not been able to welcome all because of these decisions.

With this said, I end this message with my belief in the GOOD. We are an amazingly kind and caring community. We will continue to be supportive of and invested in helping those in need. We will continue to move forward together. I would like to end with sharing with you, our mission. I along with our CBS leadership and staff are committed to being ever mindful of these ideals as we continue to navigate these uncertain times.

We seek to enrich the lives of our congregation through ever-evolving ideals of observance, life-long learning, and acts of kindness from this generation to the next.

We are committed to meeting the spiritual, educational and social needs of our members through the practice of Conservative Judaism in an all-inclusive manner.

We seek to encourage involvement and create a sense of belonging by serving our community, the Jewish people, and the State of Israel.



Northfield Food Pantry – Fern Roseman @ 847-564-9266


Not enough can be said about the need for food in our community. The Northfield Food pantry has experienced low shelves especially in the time of Covid. **Fern**
