This Week's Parashah

Moses is told to instruct the Israelites to bring olive oil to light the lamps of the Tabernacle. The lamps are to burn from evening until morning. The lamps are to be the responsibility of Aaron and his sons. Moses is told to ordain Aaron and his sons as Kohanim (priests). The Kohanim are to be adorned in special clothes: linen breeches, tunics, sashes, and turbans. The Kohen Gadol (high priest) is to wear a special robe of pure blue decorated at the hem with pomegranates and golden bells. Over this robe, an apron-like layer (the ephod) woven of gold, blue, purple, and crimson yarns is to be worn. Connected to the ephod is "the breastplate of judgment" (choshen) - a square-shaped container decorated on the front with four rows of precious stones. The Kohen Gadol is also to wear a gold plate engraved "Holy to the Lord" to be tied with a blue cord to the front of his turban. The Kohanim are to be ordained in a special ceremony, which involved first washing, dressing, and anointing them with oil, and secondly, the offering of various sacrifices. These ceremonies are to be repeated for seven days.

Today's Haftarah

Ezekiel tells of being transported, in a vision, from Babylon to Jerusalem. He is shown the rebuilt Temple, described in this reading. The rebuilding of the Temple was very important to Ezekiel and occupied a crucial place in his teachings. The haftarah describes the sacrificial altar in the Temple, linking us to this week's Torah portion, which concludes with a description of the altar in the Tabernacle. This week's Torah portion describes the construction of the Tabernacle in the wilderness. The haftarah was composed by Ezekiel during the Babylonian exile, around 586 B.C.E. With his vision of a renewed Temple, the haftarah provides a symmetry and continuity with the Torah portion linking the past with the future.
