Nanette Sawyer is a pastor at Fourth Presbyterian Church in Chicago, with responsibility for relational small group ministries, interfaith relations, and racial equity concerns.

She is a past chair of the Ecumenical and Interreligious Work Group of Chicago Presbytery and she represented the Presbyterian Church (USA) on the National Council of Churches Interfaith Relations Commission from 2008-2012. She has been a leader in the Jewish-Presbyterian dialogue between the Presbytery of Chicago and the Jewish Federation of Chicago since 2004. She co-leads the Presbyterian Muslim dialogue between the Presbytery of Chicago and the Council of Islamic Organizations of Greater Chicago (CIOGC).

Rev. Sawyer is the author of *Hospitality: The Sacred Art*, a book written from an interfaith perspective addressing the spiritual side of hospitality and how intentionality in relationships can be healing and transformative. She has articles and chapters in a number of books and magazines, including *The Christian Century; An Emergent Manifesto of Hope;* and *The Hyphenateds: How Emergence Christianity is Re-Traditioning Mainline Practices*.

Rev. Sawyer studied at Harvard Divinity School where she received a Masters of Theological Studies with a focus on Comparative World Religions. Highlights of her studies included comparative Hindu/Christian Devotional practices, Hindu/Buddhist meditation practices, the development of Christian prayer practices, and the Jewish liturgical year. She received her Masters of Divinity degree at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago and was ordained in 2002 as a Minister of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (USA).
