RABBI MELMAN'S MINUTES

Rabbi Melman



As Rosh Hashanah quickly approaches, I find myself reflecting on the past year. What did I do well and where did I fall short? I think about the same thing for the synagogue. What did we do well as a community and how can we adjust where we have fallen short?

A little over a year ago, I had the privilege to present my vision for Congregation Beth Shalom's future to our Past Presidents. We talked about understanding who we are as a synagogue, what we want to be, in an ever-changing, post-pandemic world, and how to recapture the essence of what has made CBS special for five and a half decades. That essence is YOU, all our members. At the heart and soul of our community are the people. It is our people who come to daven. It is our people who come to learn. It is our people who participate in programs. And the list goes on.

And like most things in life, growth and change are essential. They are essential to remain relevant, and they are essential to keep our congregation fresh and vibrant. That is one of the many reasons I held listening conversations over the past year. I wanted to learn what we have been doing well and where we can improve; understanding your needs only helps advance our collective ideal of keeping Congregation Beth Shalom an exciting, growing congregation. Growth does not necessarily mean getting bigger. Growth can mean a greater investment in what we do for our membership. I believe that one important question we must ask this coming year is not, how many people come to our services, classes, and programs. We should ask what is an individual's personal investment in the life of

CBS. How often is someone engaged in what we offer and what are they getting out of it?

With that in mind, over the past year, we have engaged in a strategic planning process. Our committee combined both lay and professional leadership and examined every aspect of synagogue life. We tried to determine the ways we can implement change and growth. Yes, change and growth can be difficult for some, and it is important that they be seen as evolution and not revolution.

When God commanded to Moses to send out twelve scouts, or spies, to explore the Land of Israel and bring back a report of their findings, ten of the twelve were so scared about what the future held that they brought back a false report. They told the people that there were giants in the land and that they looked like grasshoppers compared to them. These were not real giants, they were contrived in the minds of the ten because they wanted to remain where they were, remain in a place that they knew and was comfortable. Only Joshua and Caleb told the truth. They understood that what lay ahead might be scary. They knew that if they faced it together, as leaders, and as a community, they would succeed in building a new life for themselves.

Moving from one place to another physically or metaphorically can be intimidating and when we move onward from something that we have known, something comfortable, there can be a sense of loss. But an organization that does not change internally, does not change and adapt to updated methods of growth and governance, is at risk of becoming stagnant and stale. Nobody wants a stale synagogue.

FROM THE CONGREGATION PRESIDENT

Shalom Chaverim,

The suns of summer are rapidly setting which means our High Holidays are coming up quickly. Around this time of the year, I often like to pick a theme that I like to reflect upon throughout the High Holiday season. This year I am thinking about a classic 1964 song by one of our music icons, Bob Dylan, **The Times They Are A-Changin'**. We have all had the experience of thinking that time seems to defy the laws of physics. Sometimes time seems to be standing still, but more often it seems like time is flying by at an accelerated rate, especially as we age and reflect upon our lives. Here's a little teaser: I will be sharing with you during our Kol Nidre service one of those reflections that was a life altering moment for me that occurred a half century ago (Oy Vay, that sounds like too many years).

One of the things that I have learned both personally and professionally about one's response to change is that doing something new or differently is often met with discomfort and at times resistance. As I have mentioned in past articles, the Board of Trustees has been exploring a modified structure of our leadership model and one that I believe better fits today's more diverse membership makeup and will better meet our members' spiritual, social, and educational needs. As I reflect upon my own life as I am rapidly approaching the completion of my seventh decade, I believe there are a lot of parallels in the need to look at our congregation's evolving needs, strengths, and limitations over the past five decades in the same way that I realize who I was and what I needed at age 20 is not the same as who I am and what I need today. To be clear, I am not a proponent of change just for change's sake; but, in the immortal words of Bob Dylan..."If your time to you is worth savin' then you better start swimmin' or you'll sink like a stone, for the times they are a-changin'."

The challenge we face in believing in and accepting change, whether it is institutional or personal, is directly related to how well we understand it and how optimistic we are that our lives will be made better. Whether it is a slightly altered Board leadership model, a new set of prayer books, a different way to accommodate our community's High Holiday needs, a surgical procedure, a new diet, a new exercise plan, a new medication, a new home, there are no guarantees that our lives will be better. But at the same time, our community and our bodies were not designed to remain static. There are precious traditions and parts of ourselves that define who and what we are, and they should remain sacred. I can no longer run marathons because of my hip replacements, but I can still stair climb tall buildings. Healthy change is about evolving, evolving is about adapting, and adapting is about growing. If we are wise, we retain what is sacred and change so we can become the best we can be.

This High Holiday season, consider taking some time to reflect upon how our community has changed and how you have changed. Ask yourselves, am I a better version of myself because of those changes? I hope your answer is yes, but if not, then think about what you can do to make it better even if things must be done a little differently from when you were 20.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, have a safe, healthy, and spiritually enriching Holiday season.

CBS to Welcome Distinguished Speakers Joyce Vance and Neal Katyal

Please join us in-person on Wednesday, **October 18**, for a special Distinguished Speaker Series program with legal rock stars **Joyce Vance** and Northbrook native **Neal Katyal**, who attended his junior high school friends' B'nai Mitzvah at CBS!

Vance, a former United States Attorney, and Katyal, former Acting Solicitor General of the United States, and both television legal analysts, podcast hosts, and law professors, will address efforts to protect religious freedom in courts and state legislatures across the country, as well as current legal events.

As a former spokesman and attorney in the U.S. Attorney's Office in Chicago, I relied on our common Justice Department affinity to invite them and both were eager and gracious to accept.

Vance is a Distinguished Professor at the University of Alabama School of Law. She is also a legal analyst for NBC and MSNBC, the cohost of two podcasts, #SistersInLaw and The Café Insider, and writes the popular Civil Discourse newsletter on Substack.

Vance was the United States Attorney for Northern Alabama from 2009 to early 2017, after having served in that office since 1991. She is an avid knitter and might also share some Passover recipes.

Katyal's fifth argument in the U.S. Supreme Court last term was his 50th overall and a record for a minority lawyer, eclipsing the late Justice Thurgood Marshall. Once the Justice Department's top advocate in the Supreme Court, he now runs one of the largest Supreme Court law practices in Washington.

He is also a professor at Georgetown University Law Center, an MSNBC legal analyst, host of the podcast Courtside, and has won numerous legal awards.

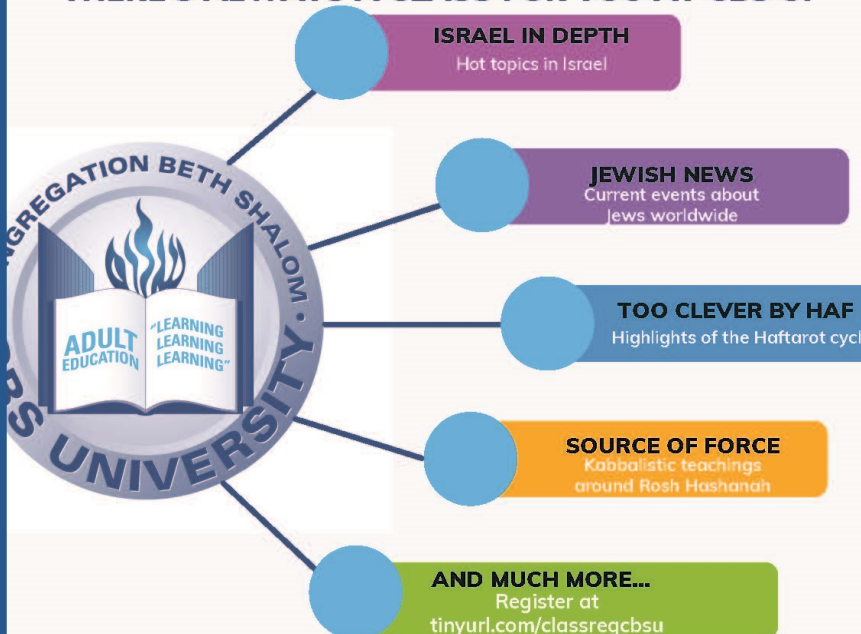

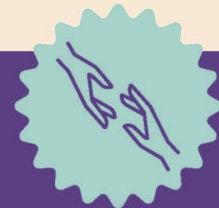

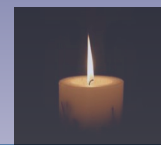
