“What ... No Calendar??”

Last month, we celebrated Yom Beth Shalom, our annual “Welcome Back” event. It was a terrific day to be part of the CBS community. Attendees went home with more than their High Holiday tickets – there were Shabbat “swag bags,” hand-decorated CBS picture frames, honey jars, and many holiday items purchased from our Sisterhood Judaica Shop. Some of you even got a photo with a sloth!

No one left empty-handed, but some felt that something was missing ... Unlike in past years, you did not receive a printed CBS calendar this year. After much consideration, we decided not to publish one this year. Some of you were disappointed about this, and you were not shy about letting us know.

I want to take a moment to explain our thinking. While printing 1000+ calendars is a major expense and an investment of staff time, not to mention a draw on natural resources, our decision was not driven by concerns of money, effort, or environmentalism. Rather, we have learned over many years that, while we try valiantly to pin

down our programs, classes, events, and meetings during the “slow” summer months, inevitably things change. Sometimes things change because we come across an unexpected opportunity, sometimes outside factors impact our planning. And when one calendar date changes, it often creates a domino effect, prompting other changes. When we look back at the printed calendar at the end of the year, just about the only dates that *didn't* change were the Jewish holidays! **Whoever coined the phrase, “Change is the only constant,” might have been thinking of the CBS Calendar.**

So, this year, we decided to turn this “flaw” into a feature and put our printed calendar on hiatus. Our entire year of programs, meetings, classes, and events is available on our online calendar at tinyurl.com/cbsnbcal and updated daily. Now, when we need to move something around, we don't have to worry that the wrong date is hanging on everyone's refrigerator.

While we know this is disappointing to some, we think it also shows off one of our strengths. We are good planners at CBS, but we also know how to be dynamic, flexible, and responsive to opportunities as they arise.

And after all, we've all heard the old saying about printed calendars... their days are numbered.

From Reflection to Joy: Staying Connected After the High Holidays

As the High Holiday season comes to a close, I want to thank you for helping to create a meaningful and moving experience for our community. Whether you joined us in person, on live stream, or found quiet moments on your own, your engagement mattered.

It is your presence, your spirit, which transforms our services from rituals into living, sacred moments. You showed up with intention, reflection, and heart, transforming our services from routine observance into something deeply sacred and alive.

On Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, we look inward at who we are, who we've been, and who we hope to become. While it is deeply personal work, the holidays remind us that we are not alone in this process. We move through these Days of Awe together, as a community. We hold space for one another. We find strength in each other's presence. In this way, the High Holidays are not only about personal transformation, but they are also about shared belonging. Yet, inside with family, friends, neighbors and strangers, we find warmth, connection, and joy.

In many ways, Congregation Beth Shalom serves a similar role. It is a home we build and rebuild together. We make room for each other. We reflect, we celebrate, we share meals, we pray, we sing, we learn - **and we do it together.**

As president, I see up close the diversity within our congregation; diverse in thought, in background, in practice, in belief, and in perspective. Our diversity is a strength to be honored. We don't have to think alike or act alike. What matters most is that we continue to show up for each other, with open minds, to listen and to care for each other.

So, I invite you, come celebrate Sukkot at CBS. Whether you prefer sukkah decorating (October 5th), the festival services (October 6, 7, 8,) SukkahFest (October 9th), or OCTOBERFEST: Tailgate at the Sukkah (October 12th), just come - eat, sing, sit and connect with each other.

And as Sukkot comes to a close, I hope you'll join us for Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah. These closing days of the festival season are powerful too; Shemini Atzeret giving us space for quiet, heartfelt prayer and Yizkor, while Simchat Torah providing the joyful celebration of dancing with the Torah as we return to the start and continue learning together. Let's continue building a community where our differences don't divide us, but instead they deepen our connections.

Wishing you a joyful and meaningful Sukkot, and a year ahead filled with shared celebration, understanding, and connection.

Small Gestures, Big Impact: Have You Filled a Bucket Today?

Although I am still new to my role as Sisterhood President, I can confidently say that a highlight of the position thus far has been getting to know more members of the Congregation Beth Shalom community. In September, it was a treat to meet new members during High Holiday ticket pickup at *Yom Beth Shalom*, during the *Welcome Back Community Dinner*, and at our *Sisterhood Opening Dinner*. It delights me to expand my circle of peers, and at the same time, I am hopeful that others are ultimately feeling welcomed, connected and included.

As we settle into the High Holiday season, I have been reflecting on the importance of and joy experienced when doing a good deed. Sometimes we imagine a mitzvah has to be something big and grand - but often it is the small acts that make the biggest difference. Calling or texting a friend to let her know you are thinking about her, giving a coworker a card on his birthday, or helping to clean up after a work or synagogue social gathering - all of these are acts of kindness that can ripple outward, inspiring others to do something to support or lift up another person who might need it.

Working in a public elementary school, while I do not teach about mitzvot, tzedakah, or *Gemilut Chasadim*, a book that I typically read to our Kindergarteners during the first month of the school year also focuses on the meaningful impact our kind words and actions can have on others. **Have you Filled a Bucket Today?: A Guide to Daily Happiness for Children**, by Carol McCloud, encourages positive behavior by using the concept of an invisible bucket to show children how easy and rewarding it is to express kindness, appreciation, and love by "filling buckets." I have come to realize that Congregation Beth Shalom Sisterhood is also built on these little gestures of love, kindness, and bucket filling, and the impact can be profound.

Whether you choose to "fill a bucket" this month by introducing yourself to someone new at our *Torah Fund* program on **Sunday, October 26**, inviting someone you do not know well to sit near you during Shabbat services, volunteering in the Judaica shop on a Sunday morning, or simply lending an ear to a friend - you are making our Sisterhood stronger. Let us keep lifting each other up with compassion, laughter, and open hearts. Together, with kindness and connection, we make our community shine!

The Send-a-Kid-to-Israel Partnership (SKIP) savings incentive program was created to anticipate and save for our children's Jewish education. SKIP allows families, their congregations, and the Jewish United Fund to become partners in planning for a young person's future Israel experience. Students in 3rd through 6th grade are eligible to enroll in SKIP; families are eligible to contribute to their children's SKIP account for a maximum of 7 years (3rd- 9th grade).

Beginning in 3rd-6th grades a family contributes \$70 per year, our synagogue underwrites \$100, and JUF funds \$85. Thus, each year a total of \$255 is placed in a special, interest-bearing account. A child who participates for the full seven years (grades 3-9) will have approximately \$2000 (\$1785 plus interest) saved to help meet the cost of an Israel trip. SKIP funds can be used after 9th grade and up to and including age 26 for an Israel Experience program. Of course, the hope is that your child will travel to Israel using these specially accumulated funds. Your portion of the SKIP funds are fully refundable at any time should your child not participate in an Israel program.

Many thanks to the Zemsky Family who sponsor the David L. Zemsky Memorial SKIP Fund that helps to financially support this wonderful opportunity for our youth! Only Congregation Beth Shalom matches each SKIP participant's \$70 contribution with \$100. The Zemsky SKIP Fund is the largest financial sponsorship among the Chicagoland synagogues.

More information regarding how to register will appear in the November bulletin. A letter of invitation to the program will be mailed mid-October to families of new and eligible students. Registration for 2025-26 will begin on **November 2**. Please feel free to contact the Religious School office for further information at 847-498-5352 or school@bethshalomnb.org.
