- August BOT minutes were approved – with 2 surname spelling corrections
- Ali Pohn gave an update on Club Spark. There are currently 13 club spark students, “sparklers”. One family of three is leaving. Two more students will be joining next month. Eight students are from CBS families. Students come from 7 schools. Club Spark mostly takes place in the youth lounge. They also use the fields and the playgrounds. Curriculum is provided by Jewish After School Accelerator (JASA). JASA provides a 5-year curriculum. This year’s focus is justice. Marketing will now change

from marketing an idea to marketing a thriving program. Camp Spark days (day off from school camp) will be offered to non-Club Spark members. Josh Kamen has been a vital part of Club Spark. They would like to hire three substitutes too.

- President's Report:
 - Sue provided a heartfelt thanks to the clergy, staff and High Holiday Committee for the beautiful High Holiday services, being a reflection of all of their dedication, talent, and love for our CBS community.
 - Sue reported the new furniture in the foyer has been donated by the Shaps-Shanin family in memory of Harvey and Thelma Shaps.
 - We will have membership numbers to report at the October or November meeting.
 - Cantor Stoehr will begin a month-long sabbatical on October 16th.
 - Mike Schuch, our trusted security leader, was selected to join the Magen Yachad Security Mission to Israel in recognition and celebration of his extraordinary dedication to the well-being of the Chicagoland Jewish Community. He and the other security professionals on this mission will learn about Israel, get anti-terrorism training and military briefings.
- CBS Mission Moment: Jill Hartzman shared her email to our clergy and staff in recognition of their tremendous work putting together Yom Beth Shalom.
- VP updates: It has been one year since our current Strategic Plan went into effect. It is our roadmap to making CBS strong and ever present for years to come. This month Fundraising will highlight how they are using our plan.
